In March 1946 after a development programme of only six months the company's first tractor was launched but the Zetor brand name was not registered until the following Augus

ntil the following August.

The bulk of the book is a historical account of Zetor tractors' development in a model-by-model basis from the first rototype up to and including the Proxima ange, which is covered up until 2009. During this time the company has sold ver 1.2 million tractors worldwide.

Although this is a slim volume it is well laid ut and obviously written by somebody who nows - and has enthusiasm for - his subject.

The final chapters look at what the future holds for Zetor and its overseas markets and has a double page spread on Zetor production history, analysing the production numbers for each tractor.
